Superman tells Mrs. Lane that he considers Earth to be the only place he can call home (Liu, 2020). And he might not hesitate to carry out extermination if necessary because Superman always considers Earth as his home.

My savior (00:18:28 – 00:18:29)

Until the end of her life, Svetlana will always believe that Superman was the savior of her life because she was convincing that there would be no one other than Superman who would be willing to save and give new hope to those whose freedom had been taken away by Stalin, as she already experiences (Liu, 2020). This sentence was said by Svetlana when she finally met Superman again after many years. This was said by Mrs. Lane because she is very sure that whatever Lex Luthor is currently working on will definitely bring about a major change that will shake the world.

Mr. President confidently tells all the reporters and media present in his speech that there is only one person who is genius enough and capable of being an equal opponent to the Soviet Superman. This action later triggers Superman to get involved in defeating the United State of America.

Wonder Woman asks Superman if he has any concerns towards the people from the United States' government (Liu, 2020). He has no worry at all because he believes that he can destroy any enemy. Superman has great faith in the power he possesses; he feels confident that there is no obstacle or barrier that can stop him. Including the threats made by the American side against him, Superman is not afraid at all.
